ROLE OF THE POLICE

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























A clinical officer should assist the victim in filling the P3 form as per MOH Directive No. MOH/DMS/ HR/11(Dated 24th May 2018)



where the crime took place to enable arrest and prosecution of the suspect

Police should not:

- Dismiss or blame the victim
- Physically examine the victim
- Expose the victim to any form of victimization
- Interfere with the evidence
- Seek favors from the victim

Who to involve:

- Close family or friends of the victim (if not the accused person)
- Parents or caregiver (for a minor)
- Medical practitioner
- Witnesses
