## **AFFIDAVIT**

I DR. KHISA WESTON WAKASIAKA of P.O Box 19460-00202 Nairobi and a resident of Nairobi in the Republic of Kenya do swear on oath and state as follows;

1. THAT I am a consultant obstetrician/gynecologist in public and private practice. I am a qualified and experienced fistula surgeon of repute with key competencies in the practice of Fistula Surgery, Obstetrics, Gynecology, STI, HIV & AIDS and a lead researcher in women's health. I am based at Hurlingham Family Health Clinic. I am also employed as an Obstetrician and Fistula Surgeon at Kenyatta National Hospital where I

provide technical support in fistula programs across Africa as well as organizing and executing reproductive health programs for the last 25 years.

- 2. THAT I hold a Bachelors of Science degree in medicine (MB. Ch.B) and a Masters in medicine in Med Obs/Gynae from the University of Nairobi. I am currently a PhD candidate at the University of Manchester, UK focusing on Pelvic Floor surgery. I attach herewith my CV and mark it as KK1 (a).
- 3. THAT I have also attached herewith the license to practice medicine for the year 2013 and 2014 and mark them as KK1 (b) respectively when I undertook the medical procedures and examination subject of this petition. I have also attached my current medical licence and mark the same as KK1 (b).
- 4. THAT on or about 22 August 2013, at my clinic Hurlingham Family Health Clinic, I received a patient by the name SWK (for the purposes of these proceedings), a 40 year old woman at that time. She informed me she was seeking information on a medical procedure known as bilateral tubal ligation (BTL). She also informed me she had been referred to me by an organization known as African Gender and Media Initiative Trust (GEM). I informed her BTL was a family planning method that was permanent and therefore cannot be reversed. She then sought to confirm whether the same had been done on her allegedly by Pumwani Maternity Hospital during her last caesarean delivery sometimes in 2010 without her

informed consent. During that procedure, she claimed to have consented to the caesarean delivery only and not BTL.

- 5. <u>THAT</u> I booked her for theatre at Upper Hill Medical Center where I have admission rights. The procedure of the nature of a diagnostic laparoscopy under general anesthesia was undertaken on 24 August 2013.
- 6. THAT the procedure revealed slightly bulky but normal uterus and ovaries. Both fallopian tubes had been ligated at the isthmus/ampulary region. Dye infiltration was also done and there were no spillage from the fimbrial ends of the tubes. With these findings, I was therefore able to confirm BTL had been done on SWK. I produce and mark "KWW2" a medical report I prepared to that effect.
- 7. THAT sometimes in October 2014, I received a patient by the name PAK (for the purposes of these proceedings), a 45 year old woman at the time. She informed me she had been referred to me by an organization known as GEM and was seeking information on a surgical procedure known as BTL. I informed her BTL was a family planning method that was permanent and therefore cannot be reversed. She then sought to confirm whether Marie Stopes International had done the same on her allegedly without her informed consent.
- 8. <u>THAT</u> I undertook physical examination of the patient. I also carried out further medical investigations inform of pelvic ultrasound- TVS adenomyosis and I was able to confirm and conclude BTL was done on

- PAK. I produce and mark 'KWW 3' a medical report dated 8 October 2014 that I prepared to that effect.
- 9. THAT sometimes in October 2014, I received a patient by the name GWK (for the purposes of these proceedings), at the time, a 40 year old woman. She informed me she had been referred to me by an organization known as GEM and was seeking information on a surgical procedure known as BTL. I informed her BTL was a family planning method that was permanent and irreversible. She then sought to confirm whether BTL had been done on her allegedly by Pumwani Maternity Hospital during her last delivery through a cesarean section. She claimed she did not consent to the procedure of BTL.
- 10. <u>THAT</u> I admitted her for diagnostic laparoscopy. I carried out the procedure and I was able to confirm BTL with no dye spill at laparoscopy and concluded BTL had been done on GWK. I produce and mark 'KWW 5' a medical report dated 8 October 2014 that I prepared to that effect.
- 11. THAT sometimes in October 2014, I received a patient by the name AMM (for the purposes of these proceedings), a 35 year old woman at the time. She informed me she had been referred to me by an organization known as GEM and was seeking information on a surgical procedure known as BTL. I informed her BTL was a family planning method that was permanent and irreversible. She then sought to confirm that the same had been done on her allegedly by Marie Stopes International without her informed consent.

- 12. <u>THAT</u> I admitted her for a diagnostic laparoscopy on 4 September 2014. I was able to confirm previous BTL with no free dye spill at surgery. I concluded BTL was done on AMM. I produce and mark 'KWW 6' a medical report dated 8 October 2014 that I prepared to that effect.
- 13. <u>THAT</u> I swear this affidavit as an expert on reproductive health programs to help this Court reach an informed conclusion as to whether the 1<sup>st</sup> to the 4<sup>th</sup> Petitioners were indeed sterilized.
- 14. <u>THAT</u> what is deponed to herein is true to the best of my knowledge, information and belief.
